ISASI 2025 – Denver



The ISASI 2025 Annual Training Seminar was held in Denver, Colorado, from the 29th of September to the 3rd of October 2025, bringing together over 300 aviation safety investigation professionals from across the globe. Organised this year by ISASI itself (as opposed to being in collaboration with a regional chapter, for instance) the seminar focused on advancing air safety through effective accident investigation, professional development and international co-operation. The theme, “Soaring to New Heights: A World of Innovation,” reflected the rapidly evolving aviation and aerospace environment.

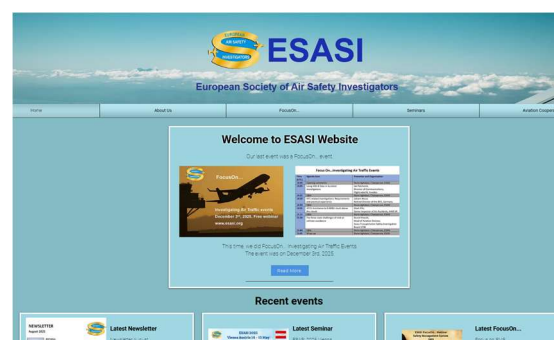
The technical programme included a broad range of presentations and panel discussions covering modern investigative methods, human and organisational factors, data analysis, materials and structures, and safety management. Significant attention was given to emerging challenges such as uncrewed aircraft systems, eVTOL operations, commercial space activities, and the increasing use of digital tools and data in investigations.

Several sessions explored the future of the profession, with discussions on training and mentoring the next generation of investigators and adapting investigative practices in an era of improving safety performance. The seminar highlighted the need to preserve institutional knowledge while incorporating new technologies and analytical techniques into accident investigation.

In addition to the technical content, ISASI 2025 offered valuable networking and collaboration opportunities through tutorials, discussions

and social events. Overall, the seminar reinforced ISASI’s commitment to enhancing global aviation safety by encouraging innovation, sharing lessons learned and strengthening the international community of air safety investigators.

ESASI New Website



In November, ESASI launched its long-awaited new website after a lot of effort from a few knowledgeable ESASI Committee members with the support of IT specialists from the UK AIB.

ESASI’s new website can be accessed at www.esasi.org. The domain change from .eu to .org reflects ESASI’s growth, maturity and recognition as a regional aviation safety stakeholder beyond the boundaries of the EU.

Investigating ATC Events was held as a virtual session on the 3rd of December 2025, focusing on the investigation of air traffic control (ATC) occurrences and their relevance in light of some recent high-profile accidents and other serious incidents currently under investigation by European SIAs. Investigating such events are particularly relevant considering that ATC events have a high potential of resulting in catastrophic consequences.

This online event formed part of ESASI's ongoing FocusOn... series, which aims to share aviation safety knowledge, case studies and experience in a concise and accessible format, to support investigators.
